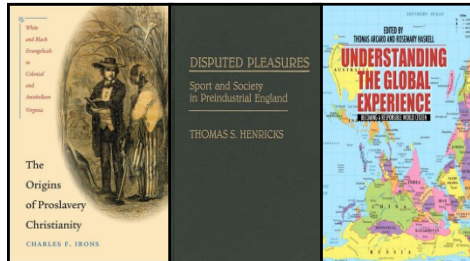


Program in African & African-American Studies
