In his four years at the helm of the Elon football program, Pete Lembo has taken the Phoenix from the bottom of the Southern Conference to quickly becoming a championship contender and a top-10 program in the FCS (formerly I-AA) national polls. Lembo has rejuvenated the Phoenix program while building support and bringing energy to the entire Elon University community.

In 2009, Lembo guided Elon to its best finish in a decade as the Phoenix went 9-3. Elon's regular-season performance earned the squad its first-ever FCS playoff berth and the Phoenix would finish the season ranked in the top-10 in both The Sports Network and FCS coaches polls. The Phoenix also earned its highest-ever SoCon finish, going 7-1 to place second in the league. With its finish, the Phoenix saw a program-best 14 players collect All-SoCon accolades from the league's coaches.

Posting an 8-4 record in 2008, the 17th-ranked Phoenix claimed the program's most victories in nine years while knocking off three top-25 teams and etching a 6-2 SoCon ledger for sole possession of third place.

During Lembo's tenure, Elon has claimed six victories over top-25 foes, made consistent appearances in the national polls – climbing to as high as No. 3 in 2008 – and has set over 100 new Phoenix, SoCon or NCAA records.

Off the field, the Elon football program has made notable improvements in the areas of academic progress, recruiting, alumni relations, home game attendance, scheduling, community outreach and fund raising under Lembo's guidance. Since Lembo's first season in 2006, attendance is up 38% at Rhodes Stadium. The football program's NCAA academic progress rate has risen to an impressive 965, putting Elon among the elite in the FCS.

At 39 years of age, Lembo remains one of the youngest head coaches in all of NCAA Division I football. His career record of 73-31 (.702) ranks him as one of the most successful FCS coaches in terms of overall winning percentage. Lembo is one of just a handful of Division I head coaches who have been named the "Coach of the Year" in two separate conferences.

Lembo was hired as Elon's 19th head football coach on December 19, 2005. He came to Elon from Lehigh University, where he compiled a career record of 44-14 in five years as head coach. During his tenure at Lehigh, the Mountain Hawks won at least eight games every season, were nationally ranked every year, captured two Patriot League championships and won a home playoff game in 2001.

In 2002, Lehigh knocked off a FBS opponent for the first time since 1987 and climbed to as high as No. 2 in the national polls. Lembo's 2001 team had an undefeated regular season, finished 5th in the country and won the prestigious Lambert Cup as the top FCS team in the East. For his efforts, Lembo received the Eddie Robinson Award as the 2001 National Coach of the Year. Lembo's career winning percentage (.759) is the highest in Lehigh football history.

Lembo is a 1992 graduate of Georgetown University, where he was a four-year starter and a team captain. The former center and business major has also coached at Dartmouth College, the University at Albany and Hampden-Sydney College. He and his wife, Jenifer, reside in nearby Gibsonville with their three children, Sophia, A.J. and Victoria.
