Head Coach – Patti Raduenz

The Elon University All-Skills Camp features Head Coach Patti Raduenz who is entering her eighth season as head coach of the Phoenix. Her 2007 squad finished the season 28-32 and 9-11 in the Southern Conference. Raduenz spent the summer of 2004 playing for the first-ever USA baseball Women's National team. Her squad represented the United States in the 2004 International Baseball Federation (IBAF) Women's World Cup in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, and the World Series held in Japan, capturing the gold medal at the World Cup. Prior to her arrival at Elon, Raduenz was the assistant coach at the University of North Carolina. She served as the hitting and infield instructor for the Tar Heels during the 2000 season. Under her tutelage, North Carolina put up the fifth-best batting average in the nation. Raduenz has also served as an assistant at California State University of Sacramento and at Iowa State University in Ames.

In her four seasons at Michigan State University, Raduenz put together a .372 career batting average. During both her junior and senior seasons, her batting average topped the .400 mark. For her senior year, she was awarded the Big Ten Medal of Honor. Raduenz also earned All-American honors and was a two-time Academic All-American. After graduating from MSU, Raduenz played for the Georgia Pride and the Durham Dragons in the WPSL. In 1997, Raduenz finished second in batting average and doubles in the WPSL.

Assistant Coach – Keli Jo Storz

Keli Jo Storz enters her third season as the assistant coach for the Phoenix. Storz is responsible for the pitching staff, including coordinating workouts, pitching practices and bullpen training. Prior to coming to Elon, Storz was the assistant coach at the University of West Alabama. She coordinated and instructed many camps/clinics for West Alabama and also instructed private and group pitching and defensive lessons. Storz spent four years as a member of the West Alabama softball team where she pitched and played 1st base and outfield. She holds the West Alabama record for career games played with 204 and career at bats with 661. She is second in Tiger history in runs scored (120) and third in career doubles (35).

The camp will be open to all campers 9-18 years of age.

What to Bring

Campers are asked to bring bat (if they have one), glove, catchers gear if attending the catchers’ clinic. No cleats will be allowed indoors, so please bring indoor shoes as well as cleats.

Enrollment

Facility/Directions

The softball field is located at East Gym on campus. Go towards Elon on University Drive for 1.4 miles. Turn Right on Hwy 70/S. Church St. Turn left onto Williamson (stop light intersection) Follow road into campus 1.7 miles. Take a right at stop light which is Haggard Ave. Go through campus and take a right on Antioch Ave. Take a left on East College. Park in the East Gym parking lot across from the softball field.

Inclement Weather

If there is inclement weather, the Camp will be moved inside to East Gym. All campers should dress appropriately (cool weather) for outdoor camp.
