Modifications and Clarifications to the NLI

Attached to this newsletter is a memo from the National Letter of Intent Program noting some notifications and modifications of the NLI policy. Please review this memo and ask Clay or Catherine if you have any questions.

Early Signing Period

The early signing period for Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Golf, Softball, Tennis, Track and Volleyball is November 9th-November 16, 2005. Please be aware of the Dead Period that surrounds this early signing period for these sports. The Dead Period is from Midnight November 7th through midnight November 10th. During a dead period, in-person contacts or evaluations, on or off campus, is prohibited. It is permissible to send general correspondence and telephone a prospect during a dead period.

NCAA Clearinghouse Fee Increase

Just a reminder to coaches about the NCAA Clearinghouse Fee Increase effective August 1, 2005. The fee for domestic students has been increased to \$50.00. For international student-athletes, the fee is \$75 dollars.

The increase is due to:

- Increased inflationary and technology costs.
- There will be a new educational and promotional information distributed to registrants.
- There will be increased scrutiny of registrant's amateurism status that has not taken place in the past.
- Registrants will continue to have the opportunity to waive the registration fee if they qualify.

While you are recruiting, please let your recruits know of this change if they have not yet registered with the clearinghouse.
