### Uniform Crime Reporting UCR Definitions

Definitions used by the United States Office of Education.

- **Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter:** The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
- **Robbery:** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force, violence, and/or causing the victim fear.
- **Aggravated Assault:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could or probably would result in a serious potential injury if the crime were successfully completed.
- **Burglary:** The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.
- **Motor Vehicle Theft:** The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. Classify as motor vehicle theft all cases where persons not having lawful access even though the vehicles are later abandoned. Includes joyriding.
- **Arson:** Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling, house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property, etc.
- **Negligence Manslaughter:** The killing of another person through gross negligence.
- **Liquor Law Violations:** The violation of laws or ordinance prohibiting: the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to minor or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on a train or public conveyance; all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.
- **Drug Abuse Violations:** Violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include: opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine); marijuana; synthetic narcotics (Demerol, methadone's); and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine).

### Location Definitions: "The Handbook for Campus Crime Reporting"

- **On-Campus:** (1) Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support of or in a manner related to the institution's educational purposes, including residence halls; and (2) Any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to the area identified in paragraph (1) that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person, is frequently used by students and supports institutional purposes 40; such as a food or retail vendor).
- **Non-Campus Building or Property:** (1) Any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by the institution; or (2) Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution that is used in direct support of or in relation to the institution's educational purposes, is frequently used by students, and is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution.
- **Public Property:** All public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus  
Residential Facilities: Dormitories or other campus resident facility for students on campus is a subset of the "On-Campus" category.
- **Hate/Bias Crimes:** Any crime (or any other crimes involving injury to any person) where the victim was intentionally selected because of his/her actual or perceived race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity or disability should be reported to Office of Public Safety.

- *This report is prepared to fulfill the requirements of Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended in 1998, the provision of an Annual Security Report as described under §668.46. This report may be found at the Campus Safety & Police web site: The report will be mailed to anyone requesting a copy. Anyone may obtain a copy at the office of the Campus Safety & Police. Statistics in this report are obtained from the incident reports of the Campus Safety & Police, incident reports of other local law enforcement agencies and information from other campus officials designated by this Act as Campus Security Authorities.*

- **BE ALERT.** Your safety depends mostly upon your own attitude and actions. Use common sense and do not place yourself in a location or situation to become a victim of crime.
- **IF YOU OBSERVE ANY SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY OR WISH TO REPORT ANY CRIMINAL ACT, CALL THE CAMPUS SAFETY & POLICE IMMEDIATELY AT 911.** For police, fire or medical emergencies, you may contact University Police by calling **911** from any campus phone. You may also use any of the emergency call boxes throughout the campus. The campus community is encouraged to report all crimes and safety-related incidents to the Campus Safety & Police as quickly as possible.
- **IF YOU BECOME AWARE OF A CRIME, OBSERVE A SUSPICIOUS PERSON OR SITUATION OR ARE A VICTIM YOURSELF, PROMPTLY REPORT IT TO THE POLICE.**
- Timely reports increase the likelihood that critical evidence will be obtained, stolen property can be recovered and the offender may be successfully prosecuted. This is especially important in cases involving sex offenses. A prompt report to the police will also ensure that you are made aware of all available victim support services.
- **AVOID WALKING ALONE AT NIGHT.** Make arrangements to walk in groups and, whenever possible, use the Campus Shuttle. If you must travel alone at night, stay on well-lit paths and sidewalks.
- **KEEP YOUR ROOM DOOR LOCKED AT ALL TIMES.** Locking your door wherever you reside, is an effective way to reduce theft and enhance personal safety. The vast majority of thefts occur from unlocked rooms when the occupant is gone only briefly. Do not prop open exterior doors, and close any doors you find propped open. Propped doors are a high risk and greatly increase chances of your victimization. Campus Safety & Police Communications monitors doors with key card readers and door alarms. Officers are dispatched immediately to investigate any propped doors. Propping doors could result in loss of campus housing and other sanctions. Do not open your door to someone you do not know.

- **DO NOT LEND YOUR KEY OR KEY CARD TO ANYONE.** your action could result in both you and/or an innocent victim being referred to the campus judicial system. Report a lost or stolen key to the police and your R.A. immediately.
- **IDENTIFY YOUR VALUABLES USING OPERATION ID.** We offer this service every Fall @ the Moseley Student Center outside the Octagon Cafe. Please check E-Net for dates and times. You may also check out the engravers from Campus Safety & Police to mark your valuables. Then record their serial numbers on the provided form. Promptly return this form to the Campus Police for filing.
- **PARK YOUR CAR IN WELL-LIT AREAS AND KEEP IT LOCKED.** Lock all valuables in your trunk.
- **REGISTER YOUR BICYCLE WITH CAMPUS SAFETY & POLICE.** They will issue a registration sticker to affix to your bicycle to deter theft and aid in recovery if it is stolen. We strongly recommend a U-bolt lock.
- **PARTICIPATE IN PERSONAL SAFETY AND SECURITY AWARENESS PROGRAMS.**  
The Campus Safety & Police frequently conduct programs that promote crime resistance skills. For information on our safety awareness programs, please call Campus Safety & Police at (336)278-5555.
- **MISSING STUDENT PROCEDURE** If anyone believes that a resident student is missing they should immediately contact the Elon University Campus Safety & Police at **911**. University Police will begin an investigation and notify Residence Life. If Campus Police determine that the student is missing for 24 hours they will notify the Town of Elon Police Department, all local and state law enforcement agencies for assistance in locating the student. If the student is under 18 years of age and is not emancipated, WFU will notify the student's parents or legal guardian.
- **EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION OF IMMEDIATE THREAT.** In the event that an emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health and safety of students or staff exists on campus. After confirmation of the emergency by Campus Police officers on scene, we shall activate all or part of the University ALERT SYSTEM which includes email messages, e-alert, messages on the website, Elon TV, and the outdoor warning system to notify the community. Faculty, staff and graduate students may register their cell phones for text/phone notification on the University website: <http://org.elon.edu/e-alert/>. This is one of the quickest ways for you to receive notification critical to your safety and well being.

### FIRE SAFETY

- Fire Drills : will be performed 4 times a year in on-campus residence halls and twice a year in houses used for student residences.
- **In 2010 there were 2 scheduled fire drills in Residence Halls and residences.**
- Individual Student Responsibilities: Wear shoes and something to protect you from the elements. Close all windows and doors and exit quietly and orderly. Leave through the pre-assigned exit or alternate and report to the determined evacuation area.
- Steps for reporting a fire: Activate the fire alarm/pull station. Evacuate the building. Call University Police at 911 and provide the following information your name your building, location of fire, nature of fire. Inform officials of any students unable to evacuate. Go to your evacuation area so Residence Life & Housing staff will know you evacuated. Wait for further instructions from emergency personnel or Residence Life & Housing staff.
- Fire Extinguisher Use : at no time should you risk your own safety by attempting to extinguish a fire or to return to a burning building!
- Fire Incident Report: all fires (active or extinguished) and false alarms must be reported to the Campus Safety & Police by calling **911**. Campus Safety & Police and the Town of Elon Fire Department will be dispatched. The Fire Department will assure that everything has been properly extinguished.
- Be thoroughly familiar with your building, the fire lanes around your building and emergency procedures. Your attitude and knowledge towards fire safety helps create a safety conscious student body.
