



Please participate in an interview opportunity with the trusted global-good project [Imagining the Internet](http://www.imaginingtheinternet.org) at Internet Engineering Task Force 92 in Dallas!

You are invited to visit at your convenience with a small team of respectful young university students who are asking people to share their hopes and concerns for the future of the Internet in quick video interviews at the IETF meeting.

**The sharing of your wisdom will help the public recognize the most important goals and issues to be addressed as everyone moves into an even-more-interconnected world thanks to your efforts.**

Imagining the Internet is a global-good Computerworld Honors and Webby Award Honors-winning project, based at Elon University in the US. It asks people to share their views about the Internet – past, present and future – to inform the public and create a historic record of the thoughts of the people who make the Internet work.

The students from Elon University will ask you a series of 5 questions that may take you about 10 minutes to answer. Questions will include: **1) Your name, work affiliation, country in which you work and briefly your role with IETF:** Briefly, who are you and what role do you play that led you here? **2) Weather analogy:** Briefly describe the state of the Internet today by starting out with one of the following weather terms – Is it sunny, partly cloudy or stormy – and WHY? **3) What new Internet improvements are just emerging?** What are *the most important and inspiring new* Internet innovations being developed now that could bloom over the next 5 to 10 years? **4) What is the greatest Internet concern?** What is the most important challenge or issue for IETF to address in order to continue to positively develop the Internet as an open global resource? **5) Action** – WHAT ACTION can be taken now or soon to ensure the best possible future? Explain.

Each participant's interview will be posted on Imagining the Internet and YouTube under a Creative Commons Attribution 3.0 license. The work of Imagining the Internet is also archived by the Library of Congress.
