K-12 Partnership Survey Quick Facts

- ❖ # of member institutions (2015-16): 34 institutions/2 sector offices
- ❖ # of college students represented: 235,000
- ❖ % of member institutions engaging in K-12 partnerships: 95%
- ❖ Throughout North Carolina these partnerships are occurring in almost every academic discipline.
- ❖ 75% of teacher education students are engaged in student support activities outside of teaching

School-Based Efforts*

**during the school day*

- ❖ 76% of these partnerships are ongoing (institution is involved at least weekly during the academic year)
- ❖ Nearly half of these efforts are curricular and half are co-curricular
- ❖ Academic disciplines, service-learning/civic engagement offices and student organizations facilitate the majority of these efforts.
- ❖ Top focus areas of partnerships: Mentoring, tutoring, reading/literacy

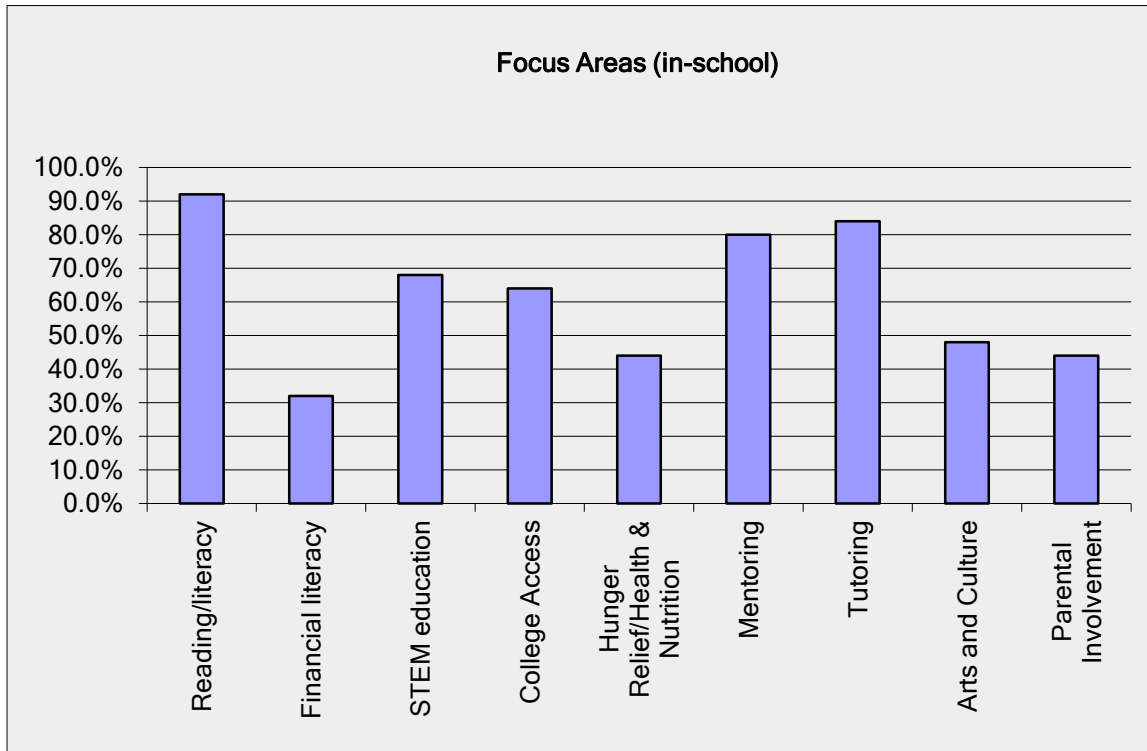
Out-of School Efforts*

**includes after-school, weekend, and summer programs and includes activities that occur with community-based organizations or K-12 schools*

- ❖ 65% of these partnerships are ongoing (regular involvement throughout the academic year)
- ❖ Only 9% of these efforts occur in the summer
- ❖ The majority (77%) of these activities are co-curricular
- ❖ Service-learning/civic engagement offices and student organizations facilitate the majority of these efforts.
- ❖ Top focus areas of partnerships: Mentoring, tutoring, college access, reading/literacy

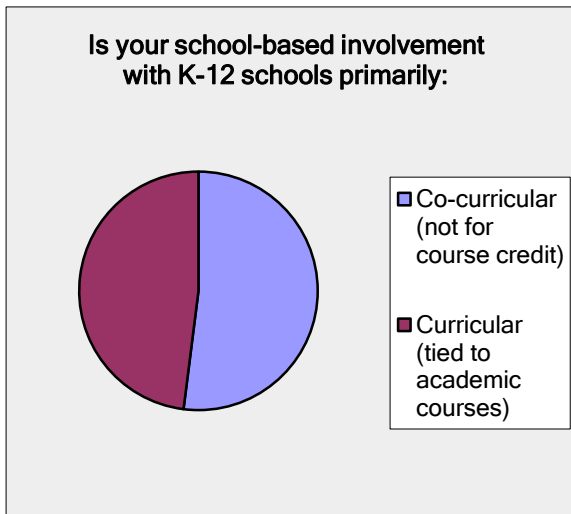
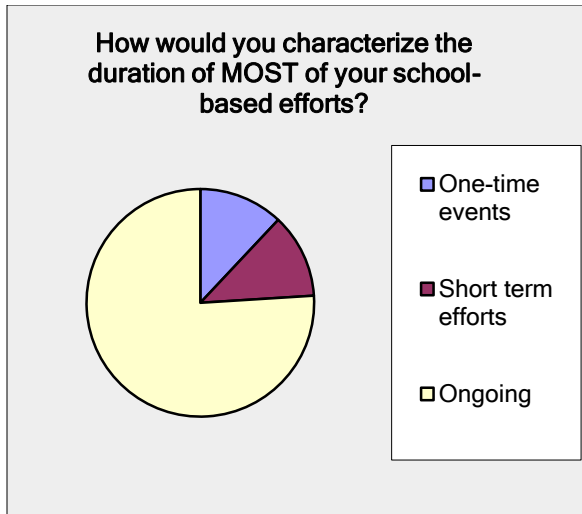
K-12 Survey Results (July 2015)

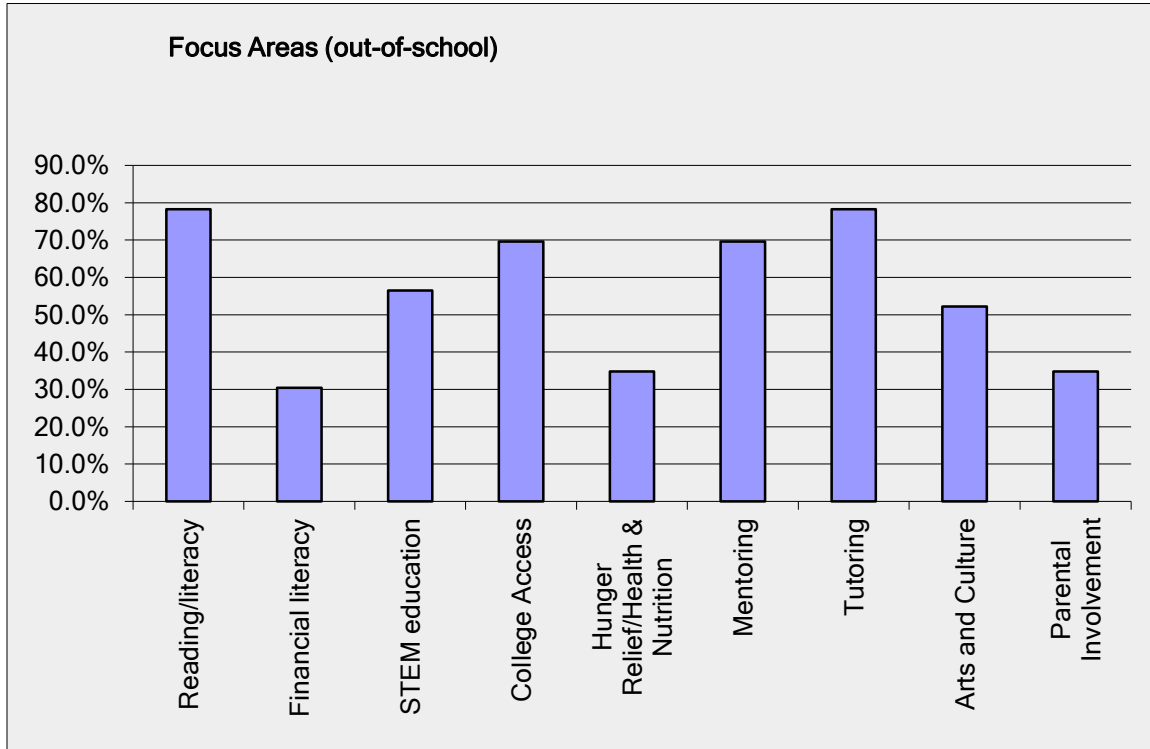

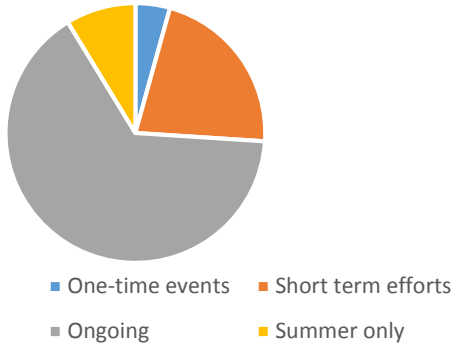

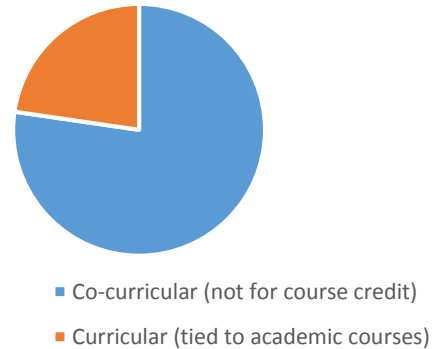
