

Career Beam: e-Library

Purpose:

The E-Library is a large collection of on-line resources that are easily accessible via links from CareerBeam. The resources are divided into several categories:

1. A – Z Index
2. Company Information
3. Industry Information
4. Global Information
5. Occupational Information
6. Salary
7. Entrepreneurial Information
8. Career Information
9. Recruiting
10. Canadian Information

Using the E-Library:

Each category is a springboard for resources in many different directions. Below is a brief synopsis of what can be found in each category.

A – Z Index: Using the Riley Guide, find links to all types of online resources from specific careers to international employment to how to find the best employers in certain locations.

Company Information: Links to find specific information on companies, such as article indexes, annual reports, business rankings, company details, and how to conduct your company research.

Industry Information: Links to specific industry resources as well as union/trade associations and general resources and directories.

Global Information: Find websites with resources for finding a job internationally as well as various government informational sites.

Occupational Information: A handy list of career sites and tools to help you research specific careers, find job clubs, and access sites like WetFeet and Vault.com.

Salary: Find links to various salary surveys and salary calculators to give you an edge as you negotiate your own salary.

Entrepreneurial Information: Interested in opening a business of your own? Find links regarding starting your own business, opening a franchise, funding your business, and finding help in the process.

Career Information: This category directs you to a collection of diversity sites, career fairs and trade shows, and job search engines that you may not have discovered yet.

Recruiting: Good resources for finding a recruiter in your location or specific field or for locating a job as a recruiter.

Canadian Information: This category is geared specifically to CareerBeam's Canadian constituency.
