Service Learning Impacting Citizenship Camp
August 3rd - August 7th, 2009

The Volunteer Center of Greensboro is looking for college students to serve as Group Leaders during our Service Learning Impacting Citizenship Camp (SLICC). SLICC is an effort to empower local high school students to impact their community as engaged and informed citizens. In 2009, SLICC campers will explore how agriculture and hunger issues affect our community. Each Group Leader will lead a team of up to ten high school students through educational activities, volunteer service, and reflection activities. Group Leaders will receive training and supervision from The Volunteer Center staff.

Volunteer Service: Group Leaders and campers will volunteer at various nonprofit agencies. In 2008, Group Leaders and campers volunteered at Greensboro Urban Ministry, Reading Connections, LifeSpan, the Welfare Reform Liaison Project, Greensboro Beautiful, the Greensboro Historical Museum, and The Adult Center for Enrichment.

Speakers: In 2008, Senator Kay Hagan and Greensboro Mayor Yvonne Johnson spoke at SLICC. Speakers from seven local nonprofits also visited SLICC and talked with Group Leaders and campers about their agencies and the work they are doing in our community.

Dates: SLICC is scheduled for Monday, August 3rd through Friday, August 7th.

Time: Camp: 8:30 am - 5:00 pm; Group Leader expected arrival and departure: 7:45 am and 5:30 pm

Location: The camp's headquarters will be located at The University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Food: Afternoon snacks and lunches will be provided by The Volunteer Center.

Transportation: Group Leaders need to have their own transportation to and from the camp's headquarters. Bus transportation will be provided to and from nonprofit agencies.

Training and Camp Preparation: Group Leaders are required to attend camp orientation and training on Saturday, July 18th and Saturday, July 25th from 9:00 am - 5:00 pm.

Stipend: Each Group Leader will receive at least \$200.

Benefits: Group Leaders will gain great experience from SLICC. Group Leaders are responsible for guiding campers toward a better understanding of their role as responsible citizens and future leaders in our community. Group Leaders will lead campers through educational activities, group discussions, and volunteer service projects. SLICC will help Group Leaders to improve their leadership and communication skills, earn volunteer service hours, and learn more about their community.

Successful applicants will have:

- an interest in working with youth
- leadership experience
- a desire to serve their community
- a desire to learn about nonprofit agencies that serve our community
- an interest in agriculture and hunger issues and their impact on our community
