Elon College awarded a record 856 degrees during its 111th Commencement exercises, held under the oaks on campus May 19.

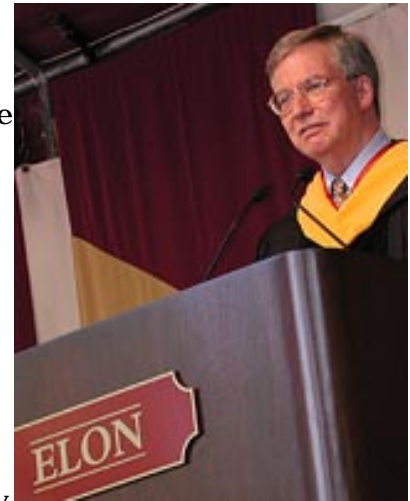
Mike Jensen, former chief financial correspondent for NBC News, delivered the commencement address. Jensen told the Class of 2001 that success comes from hard work and persistence.

This issue's **E-people** feature focuses on the most recent winners of the Daniels-Danieley Award for Excellence in Teaching and the Distinguished Scholar Award.



Ernie Lunsford, professor of Spanish, was presented with the 2000-01 Daniels-Danieley Award for Excellence in Teaching at Elon's annual Faculty-Staff Awards Luncheon on May 9.

Lunsford was praised by students and faculty alike for his innovative and enthusiastic approach to teaching.

"His students characterize him as a passionate, compassionate, organized, creative and inspiring teacher," wrote a colleague in support of his nomination. "He is extremely well-organized and prepared, demanding yet fair, patient in his efforts to explain complicated concepts, and well-respected among students."

Another colleague praised Lunsford's ability to design innovative study abroad courses: "Through careful curriculum development and extensive site research, Dr. Lunsford has packed more learning opportunities into his course than any other I know of. His students unanimously praise the class for being both rigorous and enchanting. It was Ernie's course and a few others that really put Elon on the map."

Students are appreciative of the high standards

Anne Bolin, professor of sociology, was the recipient of the Distinguished Scholar Award at Elon's annual Faculty-Staff Awards



Luncheon on May 9. Bolin's research interests include medical anthropology; sex, gender, and women; and the anthropology of sport. She has studied Native Americans and the peoples of Oceania and Western Australia.

A prolific writer, Bolin has published two books. Her first book, "In Search of Eve: Transsexual Rites of Passage," won the Choice Magazine Award for Outstanding Academic Book in 1988-89, and her second book, "Perspectives on Human Sexuality," is a major sourcebook for scholars and students. She has published 29 articles or chapters in journals and scholarly books, authored numerous book reviews, and presented more than 60 papers at professional conferences.

Colleagues note that her cutting-edge approach to research has attracted popular and scholarly attention. "Every time I have heard her present, she has not failed to stir creative, new, sometimes controversial responses from her audience," wrote a colleague. "I hear her name and work often mentioned, and it is always with the highest regard and respect."

Bolin's research into women bodybuilders led to her own involvement in the sport. She became a competitive bodybuilder herself, winning several

Lunsford sets for them in his classes. "Dr. Lunsford would assign challenging projects, such as reading a novel in Spanish or doing a 30-45 minute presentation about a Latin American country in Spanish," wrote a student. "Because he had such high expectations and was so challenging, I wanted to do better. I found myself studying more, asking more questions and searching for more answers."

Lunsford is an active member of Elon's academic community. During his term as chairman of the department of foreign languages from 1990-1994, Lunsford established majors in both Spanish and French. He helped create an international business concentration, requiring foreign language study, within the business administration major. Lunsford has also worked closely with the School of Education to create programs to prepare future foreign language teachers.

Lunsford came to Elon in 1981. He received a bachelor's degree from Duke University, a master's degree from Middlebury College and a doctorate in Spanish from the University of Florida.

Lunsford is the 29th winner of the Daniels-Danieley Award, an award for excellence in teaching established by President Emeritus J. Earl Danieley and his wife, Verona Daniels Danieley, in honor of their parents.

amateur titles in the process. "Anne doesn't simply 'do' her work. She is her work. She lives and breathes it," said a colleague.

A member of the Elon faculty since 1988, Bolin received bachelor's, master's and doctorate degrees in anthropology from the University of Colorado. She is the second recipient of the Distinguished Scholar Award, established in 2000 to recognize a faculty member whose research has earned peer commendation and respect, while making a significant contribution to his or her field of study.

Do you have questions about your benefits? This section contains frequently asked questions (and answers!) from human resources:

How do I use the Tel-Drug mail-order program?

A mail-order program is available for covered Elon employees and/or dependents who are on maintenance prescription drugs. You are able to obtain a **generic** 90-day supply if one is available for a \$14 co-payment. Just follow these easy steps:



- Have your doctor write a prescription for a 90-day supply (plus refills) of your medication. If you need a prescription right away, ask your doctor to write two prescriptions -- one to be filled by your local pharmacist (up to a 30-day supply) and one to send to Tel-Drug (up to a 90-day supply, plus refills).
- With your first order only, complete a patient profile and attach to your prescription. Patient profiles are located in the Office of Human Resources or on the Web site: www.teldrug.com.
- For your convenience, you may charge your order to a major credit card, or payment can be made by check or money order. Payment must accompany all prescription orders.
- Tel-Drug will mail your medication to your home address via first-class mail. (Overnight delivery is available for an additional charge.)

Danieley Recognized at Luncheon

President Emeritus J. Earl Danieley receives applause for 55 years of service to Elon.

President Emeritus J. Earl Danieley was recognized by President Leo M. Lambert during the Daniels-Danieley Awards Luncheon May 9 for 55 years of service to his alma mater.



An Alamance County native, Danieley graduated from Elon in 1946 with a degree in chemistry. He joined the chemistry faculty in the fall of 1946 and went on to become dean. He was named Elon's sixth president in 1957, making him one of the youngest presidents in the country at that time.

During his 16 years as president, he guided Elon to a new level of quality. Improvements were made in academic standards, faculty credentials and the physical plant. He retired from the presidency in 1973 to return to teaching.

Retirements

You probably know who has retired from Elon this year. But how much do you know about their plans for retirement? Read on to find out!

Margaret Jobe, Circulation Services Manager

As a member of the library staff since her arrival at Elon in April 1979, Margaret has seen plenty of changes on campus. But perhaps none was more dramatic for her than relocating to the new Carol Grotnes Belk Library last year. "Getting into the new building was wonderful," says Margaret. "In the old building, we had a lab and then we had 16 computers downstairs, but those were only for database research. We love it over here."



Margaret handled a variety of duties in the old McEwen Library and in Belk, including circulation, research and government documents. She says she's enjoyed the people she has worked with over the years.

"I have really enjoyed working with the staff we've had," she says. "And I've enjoyed the students . . . both the ones who work for us and the ones we help in the library. It has been really rewarding to work with them."

Margaret's husband, Loyd, is retired, so they will spend a great deal of time visiting their grandchildren in Raleigh. And Margaret predicts she'll stay busy with volunteer work at her church and in the community. "I'm not one to just sit and hold my hands together," she says.

Linda Weavil, Professor of Business Administration

When the reality of retirement actually hit her about a month ago, Linda went to her files at home and pulled out her old grade books, curious to know just how many students she taught during her career. "I counted 5,255 of them. I was just amazed by that figure," says Linda, who came to Elon in 1973.



She's been a mainstay in the business department ever since. One of the highlights of her career, she says, was the addition of the MBA program, which graduated its first class in 1986. "For about 10 years, I was the only person to teach those courses," Linda says. "So that was a lot of teaching at night."

While she points out that they won't move there permanently, Linda and her husband, Bob, do plan to spend more time at their beach house at Salter Path. "We're also going to Italy this coming fall, and we'll do some other vacationing we haven't had the time to do," she says. In addition to her work with the Red Cross, Alamance Regional Medical Center and the Love School Advisory Board, Linda also plans to spoil her granddaughters, Kathryn, age 4, and Caroline, age 2.

Carole Chase, Professor of Religion

Carole says she's proud of the strides Elon has made over the years, especially in the quality of its students. "When I first came here, our students were not that strong, and many of them came here because they couldn't get into school other places," says Carole, who joined the faculty in 1976. "Today, Elon is the first choice for just about all of our students. I would have to say the improvement in academic standards has been one of the highlights of my career."



While she is retiring, she won't be leaving Elon. "I'm staying right here," she says, adding that she plans to take some art and computer classes on campus this fall. "And I'm going to spend the summer cleaning out the office and my house. Those are things which I haven't been able to get to in years!"

Carole will also work on getting some of her prose and poetry works published. She has already written a book, which will be published in September. "Madeleine L'Engle Herself: Reflections on a Writing Life" is a collection of L'Engle's thoughts and reflections on writers and their works over the years.

While she may do some adjunct teaching at Elon next spring, Carole says some quiet time and reflection are her immediate priorities. "I'm going to let my body and mind rest and catch up," she says.

Judy Prevette, Secretary, Health Services

Caring for Elon's sick students and staff is a lot more fun than most people think, says Judy, who retired April 27 after 11 years at Elon. "There is never a dull moment in health services," says Judy. "Every day was different, so if variety is the spice of life, we definitely had it!"

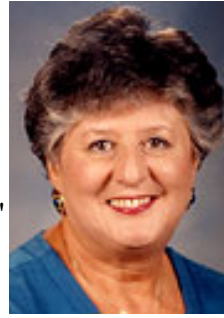

**Ellen Gagnon, Data Entry and Records Clerk,
Admissions**

Ellen came to Elon in 1977 and worked in student affairs for 11 years before moving to admissions. "Student affairs handled a little bit of everything when I worked over there," she recalls. "We handled traffic matters and discipline in that office in those days."



While she remembers the circular driveway that used to run in front of Alamance Building, she has been excited to see the changes that have taken place at Elon during her career. "A lot has changed, but there's no doubt in my mind that it is all for the better," she says.

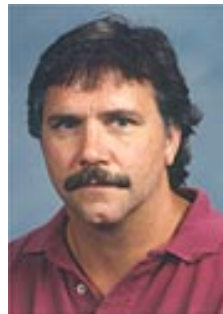

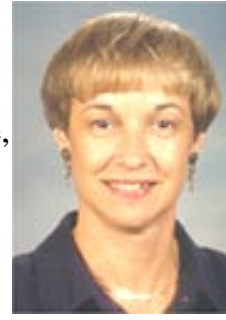
