

The Tikvah Israel Fellows at Ein Prat

June 18 to July 24, 2012



Announcing the Tikvah Israel Fellows Program, an opportunity to spend five weeks in Israel immersed in the study of Jewish and Zionist thought and Israeli culture.

Drawing on the canonical texts of Judaism and the great works of Western civilization, the Fellows will explore the ideas that have informed Zionism from its origins through the present, and engage in a broad discussion regarding Israel and its future. Students will have a chance to learn from prominent Israeli public figures and intellectual leaders including Dr. David Hartman, Dr. Daniel Gordis, and Professor Moshe Halbertal.

The program will take place at the Ein Prat Academy for Leadership. Ein Prat is a unique institution, located in the Judean hills. Under the leadership of its director, Dr. Micah Goodman, its mission is to enrich the Jewish and Zionist character of Israel, strengthen the fabric of Israeli society, and build a bridge between Israel and world Jewry. Each year, Ein Prat brings together hundreds of secular and religious Israelis for intensive programs in Judaism, Zionism, and the great texts and ideas of Western civilization. The Tikvah Israel Fellows will live and study with their Israeli peers and have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to deepen their knowledge of Judaism and Israel as well as explore the country on hikes and cultural field trips.

Air travel and all programmatic costs, including tuition, housing, and meals will be covered, and all Fellows will receive a \$2,000 stipend. Applicants must come from countries other than Israel and must be native English speakers or have very strong English skills. In addition, applicants must be between 20 and 29 years of age. Applications from Jews and non-Jews are equally welcome. All food will be kosher and all programming will be Shabbat friendly.
