Student Achievement and Success 2014

To fulfill its mission, Elon University monitors student achievement in multiple ways during the time students are enrolled and once they have graduated. Examples of Elon's goals for student achievement and the success of students in achieving those goals are provided below. These include first- to second-year retention, persistence to degree (graduation rate), participation in selected high impact practices, outcomes for licensing examinations, and students' success in securing jobs or continuing their education after graduation. To benchmark student success in achieving the goals, Elon University uses information from the sources identified below.

Retention from first- to second-year

Goal: Elon's first- to second-year retention will exceed the national average retention for selective four-year private colleges and universities as reported by [ACT](#).

6-Year Graduation Rate









Additional Recognition for High Impact Practices

Elon University has been recognized by [U.S. News & World Report](#) for **7** high-impact educational programs that “Focus on Student Success.” Based on a survey of higher education leaders across the country, Elon is noted for excellence in **study abroad, internships, service learning, undergraduate research, learning communities, first-year experiences, and senior capstones.**

The Institute of International Education’s Open Doors report ranks Elon University **#1** for masters-level universities for the total number of students who **studied overseas.** Elon has been the top ranked masters-level institution for several years.

Elon University has been named to the Presidential Honor Role for **Service** by the Federal Corporation for National & Community Service every year since 2006.


Post-Graduate Employment and Graduate/Professional Education (2014 Graduates)

Goal: Within one year of graduation, Elon graduates will have secured employment or admission to graduate or professional school at rates that meet or exceed the averages reported by the [National Association of Colleges and Employers First Destination](#) report.

Graduates may be both employed and continuing their education. When graduates are counted only once, **89%** of students are employed, have been accepted to graduate or professional school, are completing a post-graduate internship/fellowship, or are working for a service organization (e.g., Peace Corps, Teach for America). The survey response rate was 96%.

Additional indicators of post-graduate success

Elon University ranked **#3** on the annual list of U.S. master’s-level institutions whose graduates received Fulbright awards for 2014-2015.

92% of 2014 graduates who are employed report that the position is related to their career goal.

Licensing Examinations

One undergraduate program and three graduate programs at Elon culminate in a licensing examination. Recent student success rates are described below.

Education – Undergraduate and Graduate (Praxis);

Students earning AB or BS degrees in education must complete the Praxis examination. The success rate for 2012-2014 Elon undergraduates was **100%**.

For M.Ed. students, the Praxis II is required only for those changing the area of the initial license. Because most Elon M.Ed. students do not change teaching areas, the number of students taking this exam is low. The success rate for M.Ed. students taking the exam from 2012-2014 was **90%**.

Law – Graduate Only (Bar)

The class of 2014 bar passage rate was **67%** overall and **69%** for within jurisdiction (NC).

Physical Therapy – Graduate Only

Students graduating with degrees in Physical Therapy are required to take a qualifying test from the Federation of State Board of Physical Therapy. The overall pass rate from 2012-2014, as reported by the Federation, was **99.4%**.

Physician Assistant Studies – Graduate only

The first class of Physician Assistant Studies graduates achieved a 100% first-time pass rate on the Physician Assistant National Certifying Exam. The national average for test takers is 94%.
