

scholarships & financial aid

At Elon, the first financial aid policy is to keep the cost reasonable. According to the latest statistics available, the cost of tuition, fees, room and board at Elon is 9 percent below the national average for private colleges and universities. We invite you to compare the quality and cost of an Elon education with any other private institution.

Merit-based scholarships and application/award procedures

Presidential Scholarships: Presidential Scholarships of \$2,000 to \$4,500 are awarded annually to the top 25 percent of incoming freshmen. Awards are based on high school transcript and SAT/ACT scores. **No separate application is needed.** Qualified students are automatically awarded scholarships when the freshman application is reviewed. Scholarships are renewable annually for a total of four years based on acceptable academic performance.

Fellows Scholarships: Annual Fellows Scholarships of \$2,500 to \$8,000 are awarded to the top freshmen selected as Honors, Elon College (arts and sciences), Business, Journalism and Communications, and Leadership Fellows. These are in addition to any Presidential Scholarship.

Fellows application is due January 10.

Engineering Scholarships: Four scholarships of \$3,500 are awarded annually to incoming freshmen majoring in engineering. These scholarships are in addition to any Presidential Scholarship. An

Engineering Scholarship application, letters of recommendation and an interview are required. **Deadline for applications is January 10.** Scholarships apply to Elon tuition only.

Performing Arts: Amounts vary. Awarded by the department based on audition. Contact the Department of Performing Arts for complete information at 336-278-5600. *Note: Admission to Elon and a music or performing arts program requires two separate applications.*

Athletics: Performance based. Amounts vary. Awarded in all sports by Department of Intercollegiate Athletics in compliance with NCAA Division I regulations.

ROTC: The U.S. Army and Air Force offer three- and four-year scholarships awarded according to merit, not financial need. In addition, Elon provides all ROTC scholarship winners free room and board during the time the ROTC scholarship pays tuition. For more information, contact your high school guidance counselor or local recruiter.

Just for North Carolinians

\$1,950 for every North Carolina

resident: Every North Carolina resident attending Elon as a full-time undergraduate student receives the N.C. Legislative Tuition Grant. The 2007—2008 grant was \$1,950.

The Leon and Lorraine Watson North Carolina Scholarship Program: Eight \$10,000 Watson Scholarships are awarded

annually to North Carolina students who have strong academic records and high financial need. The Watson Scholarship, in combination with other aid, should meet up to the full cost of tuition, fees, room and board. Watson Scholarships also include a one-time grant of up to \$4,000 to fund a study abroad experience. The Elon University Endowed Scholarship Application is required and must be submitted by **February 10.**

The Honorable Thad Eure North Carolina Achievement Scholarship:

This scholarship recognizes talented students with financial need from 13 counties in the Piedmont region* of North Carolina as well as Mr. Eure's home county, Gates County. Three \$12,000 scholarships are awarded annually to incoming freshmen. Students also receive one \$5,000 Elon Experiences grant in addition to other program benefits. The Elon University Endowed Scholarship Application is required and must be submitted by **February 10.**

*Eligible recipients will reside in and graduate from a high school in one of the following counties: Alamance, Caswell, Chatham, Davidson, Durham, Forsyth, Gates, Guilford, Orange, Person, Randolph, Rockingham or Wake.

North Carolina Teaching Fellows:

\$14,000 minimum, plus airfare for one semester in London or Costa Rica. Selected by N.C. Teaching Fellows Commission. Applications are available in high schools and are **due in late October.**

Approximately 60 percent of Elon students receive some form of financial aid. Elon offers several financial planning options.

Financial aid for those who need it

Need-based assistance: For students who qualify for need-based assistance, Elon offers a full range of federal, state and institutional grants, loans and scholarships. The amount of federal aid you are qualified to receive will be determined from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Institutional financial aid eligibility is based upon additional information collected on the CSS PROFILE Form. If your aid file is complete by mid-March, you will be eligible for the maximum amount of aid Elon is able to offer.

A number of need-based endowed scholarships are available to incoming freshmen. Students must submit the Elon University Endowed Scholarship application by **February 10**. Full details about the scholarships, award amounts and the application are available on the website: www.elon.edu/finaid.

Non-need-based loans: For families who don't qualify for need-based assistance, Elon participates in several loan programs not based on need.

Payment plan: Elon offers a 10-month payment plan in cooperation with Academic Management Services. Charges for the academic year may be made in monthly payments beginning in June.

To apply for financial aid:

1. As soon after Jan. 1 as possible, file the FAFSA Form (available online or in your high school guidance office). This will allow time for your application to be processed before the mid-March priority deadline at Elon. [www.fafsa.ed.gov]
2. As soon after Jan. 1 as possible, file the CSS PROFILE Form with the College Scholarship Service. [profileonline.collegeboard.com]
3. Before mid-March, file an Elon Financial Aid Application with the Office of Financial Planning (application available from the Office of Admissions or online at www.elon.edu/finaid).

Note: Do not wait to be accepted to file for financial aid.

Early Decision Plan

Application Deadline: November 1

Notification Date: December 1

Students whose first choice is Elon are encouraged to apply Early Decision. The Early Decision Agreement is a binding agreement committing a student to enroll at Elon if accepted. Students accepted under Early Decision agree to withdraw applications from all other colleges and submit a nonrefundable US \$500 deposit by January 10. **You must complete and sign the Early Decision Agreement on the back of the application** to be considered under the Early Decision plan. There are several advantages to being accepted under the Early Decision Plan:

- the opportunity to attend the first Spring Orientation Weekend
- priority consideration for housing and course registration
- an early financial aid estimate.

Early Action Plan

Application Deadline: November 10

Notification Date: December 19

Students who would like an early answer on their application status may apply Early Action. Early Action is nonbinding, and students are permitted to apply to other schools as well as Elon.

Final Application Deadline and Fellows Application Deadline

Application Deadline: January 10

Notification Date: March 13

This is the final application deadline for freshman admissions. Applications received after this date will be considered on a space-available basis.

The Fellows application must be submitted by January 10. Students selected for the Fellows competition will be notified of their admission decision at the time the Fellows invitation is extended in early February.

Students who wish to be considered for Tuition Exchange must submit the freshman application no later than January 10. Institutional certification is required.

Admissions Procedures

Your application cannot be processed until the following documents have been submitted. The completed application is confidential and will become the property of Elon University.

A completed application includes:

- completed and signed application including required essay and character statement

- nonrefundable US \$50 application fee. Elon University participates in the College Board Fee Waiver Program. The form for this waiver can be obtained from your high school guidance office.
- official high school transcript
- Counselor Evaluation Form. Give the Counselor Evaluation Form (included with the application) to your guidance counselor to be submitted with your high school transcript and a list of courses you are taking. Please note: Personal recommendations are not required for admission.
- Official SAT, ACT or TOEFL scores. Arrange for SAT or ACT score reports to be sent to Elon. Elon's code for the SAT (CEEB code) is 5183; for the ACT, it is 3096. Students must submit a writing score as part of their standardized test profile. Either the SAT or ACT writing test will meet this requirement. If a student takes *only* the ACT, a score from the writing section will be required. Students will also need to provide Elon access to the original composition. Elon combines your best math, critical reading and writing scores. Be sure to send us scores from **all** tests taken.

Additional Application Information for International Students

- Your application must also include an official certified English translation of your complete academic record documenting your secondary school studies, including mark sheets and examination certificates earned.
- In addition to submitting SAT/ACT scores, the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) is considered in the admission decision for international students unless English is a student's native language or the language of instruction. An application is available at www.toefl.org.
- For visa purposes, a completed Certificate of Financial Responsibility (CFR) should be submitted with your application. You may download this form from www.elon.edu/admissions/apply.xhtml.

Application Type and Submission

Elon accepts applications online and in paper format. Students may choose the format they prefer; however, online applications are strongly encouraged. Both are available from Elon's Web site, www.elon.edu/admissions, and no preference will be shown in the admission decision. **It is not necessary for students to complete a paper application if they have submitted an electronic application.** Students who submit an application by courier should send materials to 2700 Campus Box, 100 Campus Drive, Elon, NC 27244. Elon does not accept the Common Application.

Admissions Policy

Admission to Elon is competitive. More than 9,000 applications are received for the 1,275 available openings in the freshman class.

The most important factors in the admission decision are the academic record, including the courses taken and the grades attained, followed by SAT or ACT scores. Other factors which may be

considered include leadership potential, extracurricular and service-related activities, special talent, relationship with the university and ability to contribute positively to the campus community. A campus visit is highly recommended. Individual appointments may be scheduled if desired, but will not be formally used in the admission decision

Applicants are encouraged to pursue a rigorous program of study including the following distribution of courses:

- English..... 4 units required
 - Math 3 units required, 4 recommended
(*Algebra I&II and Geometry are required.*)
- Science..... 3 or more units, including at least one lab science
- Social Studies..... 3 or more units, including U.S. History
- Foreign Language... 2 units required, 3 recommended
(*Students who have not completed at least two units in one foreign language must complete a 121-level foreign language course at Elon.*)

Scholarships and Financial Aid

Presidential Scholarships

No separate application required. Presidential Scholarships of \$2,000 to \$4,500 annually are awarded based on information submitted in the freshman admission application. Notification of a Presidential award is made at the time of acceptance.

Fellows Scholarships

Fellows Application Deadline: January 10

A limited number of additional scholarships ranging in value from \$2,500 to \$8,000 annually are available through the Elon University Fellows programs. A separate application is required. For information about these programs, contact the Office of Admissions or visit www.elon.edu/fellows. **You do not need to wait to be accepted to Elon to submit a Fellows application.**

Engineering Scholarships

Engineering Scholarship Application Deadline: January 10

Students who plan to major in Elon's dual-degree engineering program may compete for scholarships valued at \$3,500 annually. A special application and interview are required. Visit www.elon.edu/admissions/engineering for information and the application.

Other Merit-Based Scholarships

Financial Aid

Elon requires the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the CSS PROFILE and the Elon University Financial Aid Application for applicants to receive some form of need-based financial aid.

You do not need to wait to be accepted to apply for financial aid. The FAFSA and the CSS PROFILE forms should be completed and submitted to the processor by mid-February in order to meet Elon's mid-March priority deadline for completed financial aid applications.

The FAFSA and the registration form for the CSS PROFILE can be obtained from high school guidance offices or the Office of Financial Planning or through links at www.elon.edu/e-web/admissions/FinancialAid/applying.xhtml

There are several endowed scholarships awarded to students with verified financial need. To be considered for one of the scholarships, the Elon University Endowed Scholarship Application is required and due February 10.
