- o Fill out the Form DS-160 (Nonimmigrant Visa Application) https://ceac.state.gov/GENNIV/default.aspx

- o Make sure you sign **your SEVIS I-20 Form** or Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant (F-1) Student Status and **if you are under 18 a parent or guardian has to sign as well.**
- o Valid passport (Machine Readable Passport is required at U.S. Borders as of June 26, 2005.)
- o Acceptance/letter of admission from Elon University Admissions Office
- o Evidence of financial ability to meet expenses (e.g., bank statement)
- o Evidence of English proficiency (e.g., TOEFL score) if applicable
- o Be prepared to discuss, if you are asked, your strong ties to your home country (e.g., marriage certificate, housing/mortgage agreement, job assignment after F-1 period, a letter/contract letter from current employer, all with English translation) and your intention to depart the U.S. after completion of your degree
- o One (1) photograph (see the format explained in nonimmigrant photograph requirements http://travel.state.gov/visa/visaphotoreq/digitalimagereq_5327.html
- o Machine Readable Visa (MRV) surcharge fee (check the fee with the U.S. Embassy/Consulate in your area)
- o Visa reciprocity fee (if applicable) http://travel.state.gov/visa/fees/fees_3272.html
