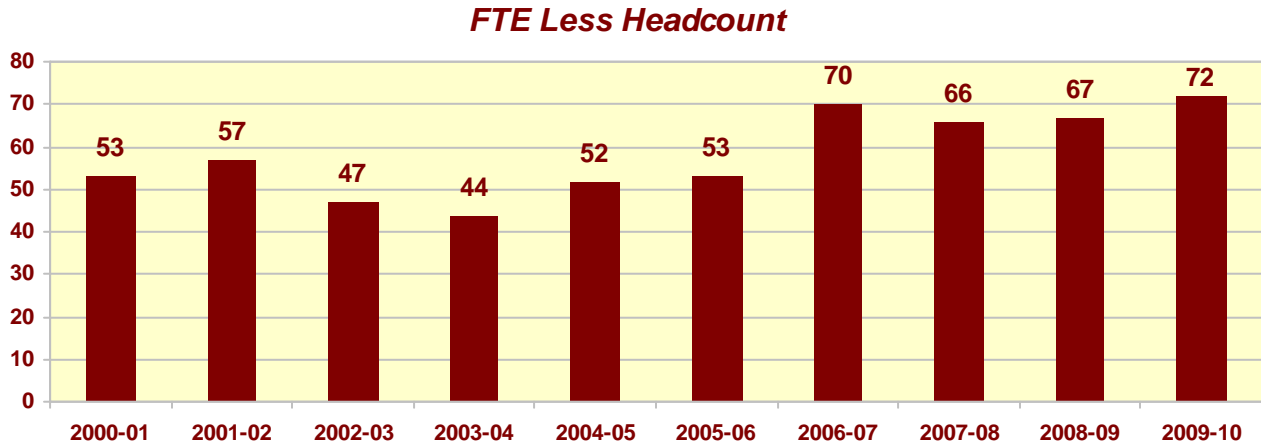

In 2009-10 Elon added 10 new full time instructional faculty members. The difference between full time faculty and FTE faculty increased from 67 to 72.



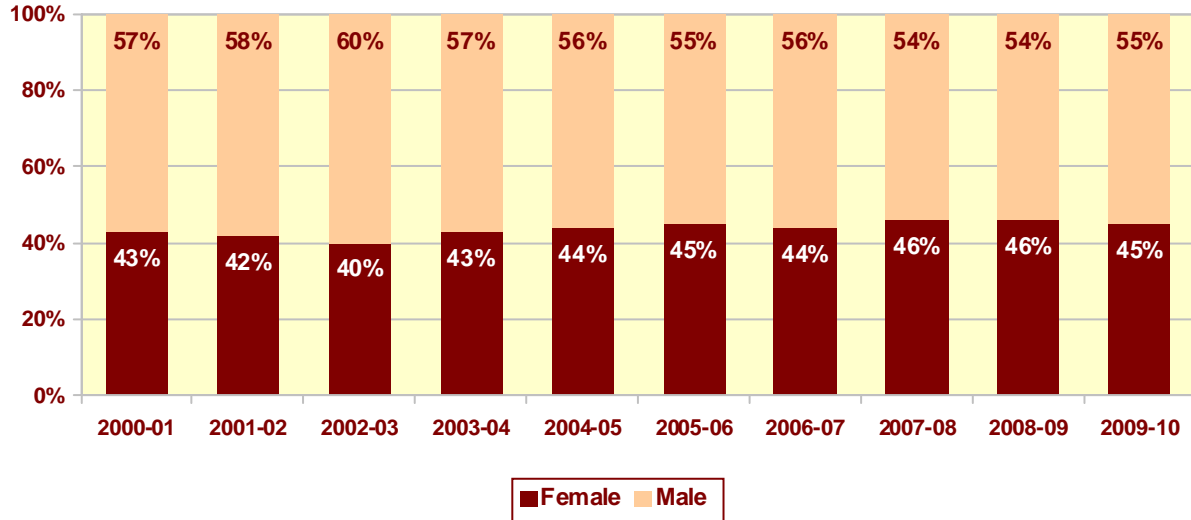

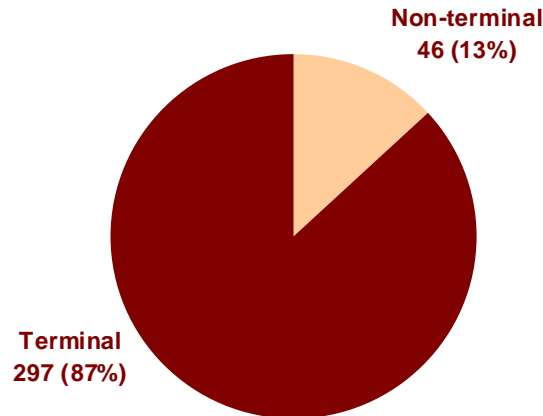

Terminal Degrees

In 2009-10, the percent of faculty that hold a terminal degree increased from 86% to 87%. Terminal degrees include doctorate, master of fine arts (MFA), and master of social work (MSW). Nationally, approximately 68% of faculty teaching at private masters-level colleges hold terminal degrees*.

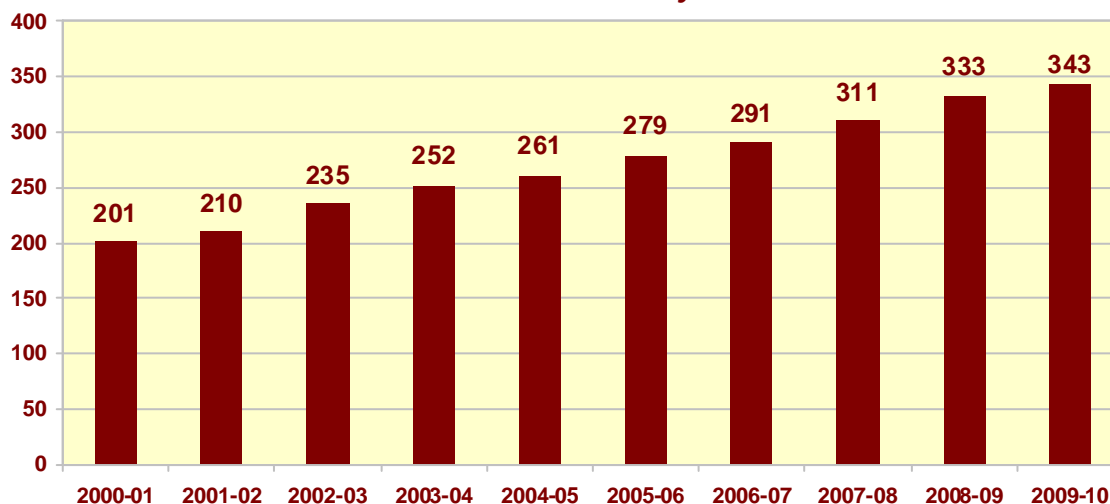

Total full time faculty by rank is shown in the table below.

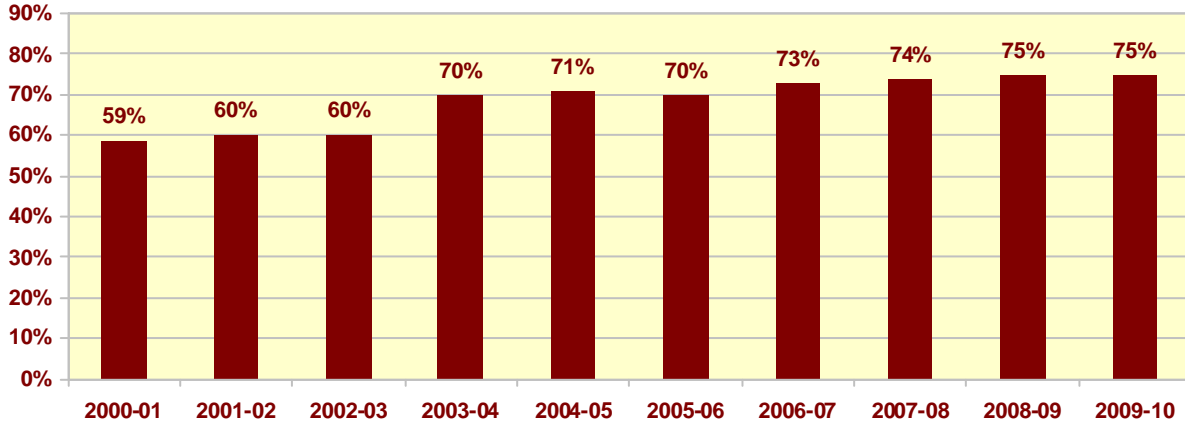

Tenured/Non-tenured Faculty

Track positions at Elon include tenure, professional, continuing, lecturer, and limited. This provides flexibility for both faculty and the institution. As indicated in the graph below most faculty (75%) are either tenured or on tenure track. Nationally at private masters-level colleges, approximately 70% of faculty are tenured or on tenure track*.

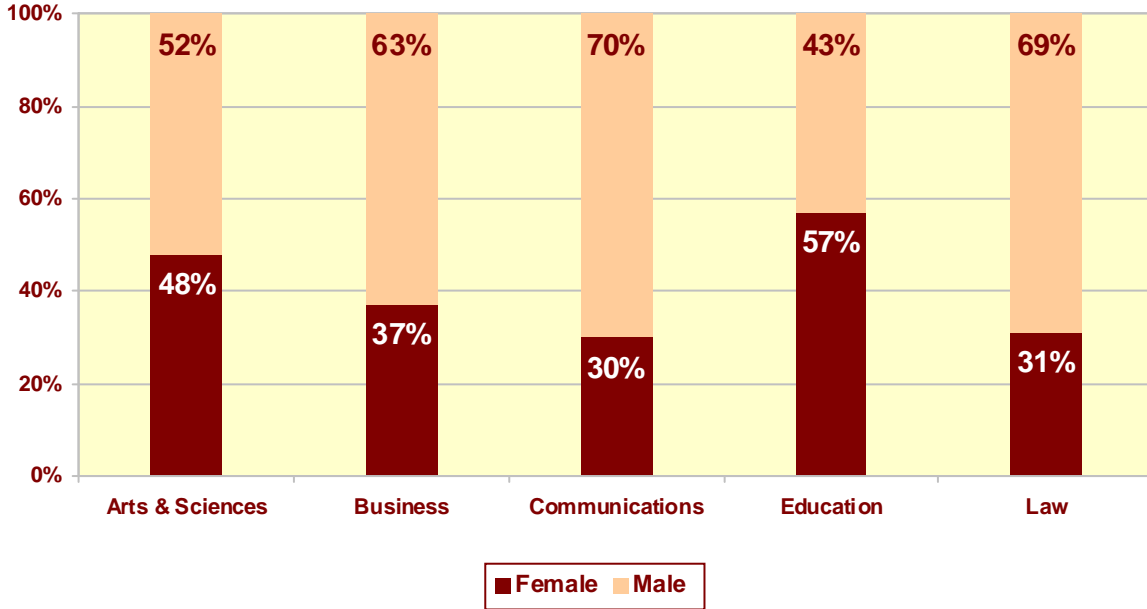

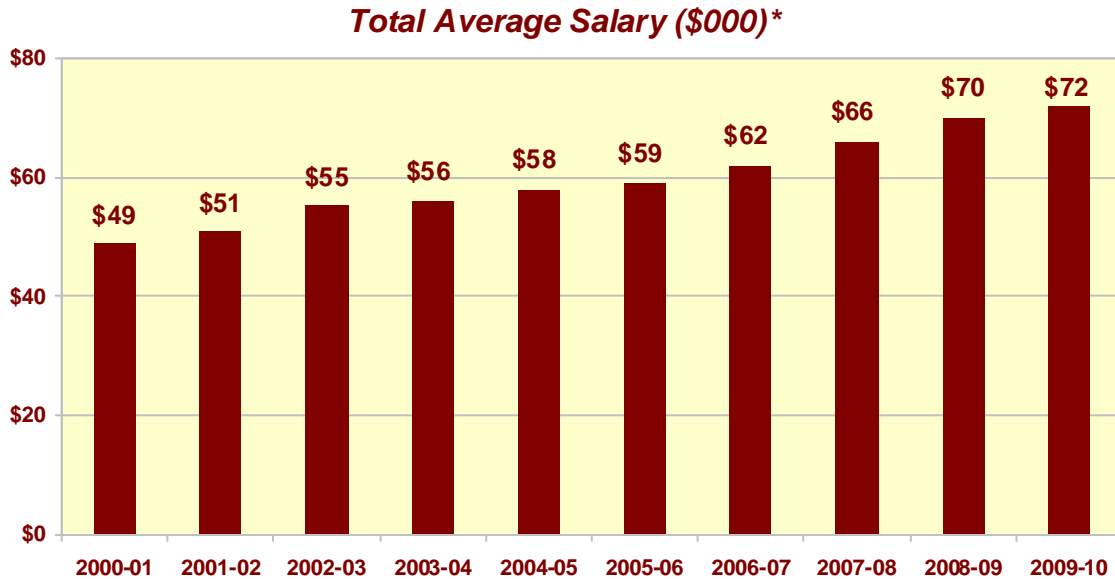
