THE ELON SHIELD

Elon's shield was adopted in 2016 and includes a stylized flame-leaf icon. Half of the icon is in the shape of an oak leaf – Elon is the Hebrew word for oak and the college was founded in a grove of stately oak trees in 1889. The other half of the icon is made up of flames, symbolizing the 1923 fire that shaped the history of the institution and sparked its rise to become a thriving national university.



The shield is primarily used along with Elon's wordmark. Use of the shield as a stand-alone mark must be approved by University Communications.

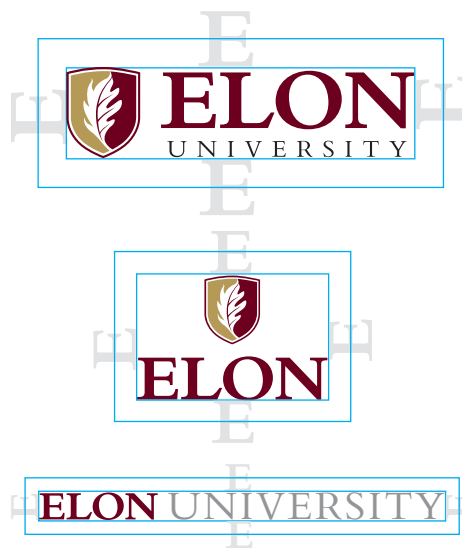
MINIMUM SIZE

In order to maintain legibility, please use these marks no smaller than the sizes indicated on these diagrams.



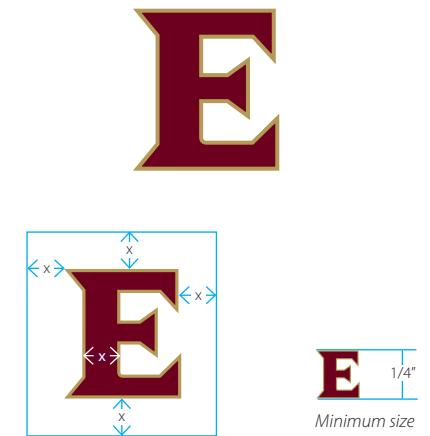
VITAL SPACE

The area around all Elon marks must be free of any other text or graphic elements. Use 1/2 the height of the letter E to measure the required clear space around the signatures and wordmarks.



THE ELON MONOGRAM

The Elon University monogram E was adopted in 2016 to provide a distinctive symbol for a wide variety of uses, both institutional and athletic.

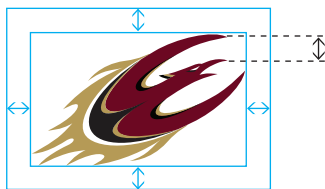


Secondary Athletics Signature

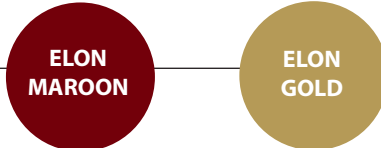
THE ELON UNIVERSITY SEAL

The official Elon University seal was created in 1908. It includes the latin words, "numen lumen" – spiritual and intellectual light, which is the university's motto. Elon's seal is used for only the most formal applications, appearing on university diplomas, formal invitations and ceremonial documents deemed appropriate by the Office of the President. It is not available for download and may not be used without permission of the Office of University Communications or the Office of the President.



ELON COLORS

Maroon and Gold were adopted as the Elon colors in about 1910. The core color values are embedded in the official digital files and should never be altered. Use of this color guide can be used to match colors and backgrounds in print or digital production.

DOs AND DON'Ts

Elon marks may not be altered in any way. Always use approved artwork files. Do not change the color or proportions or attempt to typeset, add words, other symbols, or create any Elon-related logos on your own.

CHOOSING A FILE FORMAT

EPS and PDF files are vector images and may be enlarged and reduced without affecting image quality.

JPG and PNG files are raster images and may be reduced but NEVER enlarged. Enlarging them will diminish image quality. **72 dpi** files are used for digital purposes and **300 dpi** files are used for print. This is noted in the file names.

EPS, PDF and PNG formats preserve background transparency and can be superimposed on a colored backgrounds.

JPG files are built with background colors (including white) and appear to be in a box unless superimposed on a color that matches the file background.

Note: EPS, JPG and PDF **cmymk** files (noted in file names) should be used for color printing on office printers and at the Elon printshop. For off-campus production, ask your vendor for color specifications because some production processes require Pantone colors. These (EPS or PDF) files names include "pms".
